Since its initial publication in 1992, *Textual Criticism of the Hebrew Bible* has established itself as the indispensable resource for student, teacher, and researcher.

In this completely revised fourth edition, Emanuel Tov once again proves himself the authority on the text of the Hebrew Bible. While Tov incorporates the last ten years of scholarship, including the new studies on the Dead Sea Scrolls, *Textual Criticism of the Hebrew Bible* presents a more simplified and practical analysis than its earlier editions. Simplification consists in the reduction of the theoretical introductory material in the first nine chapters. The practical aspects of this book are shown by the increase in tables, the many samples from scrolls and editions accompanied by explanations, and the suggestions for exercises.

Moffitt adopt five major aims: (i) to explore how the Bible came to exist, dealing with the formation and significance of the Christian canon; (ii) to discuss the ways the Bible continues to exert influence on contemporary culture, demonstrating the ongoing value and importance of biblical literacy; (iii) to introduce readers to some of the most fundamental methods used in the study of the New Testament, including a substantial discussion of semiotics and its usefulness for New Testament interpretation; (iv) to provide a survey of central historical, social, and economic information as important contextual knowledge for interpreting the New Testament; and (v) to offer some brief discussion of the contents of several New Testament texts and consider ways they might inform theological reflection. In the end, Alkier and Moffitt's *New Testament Basics* fosters within students important competencies needed to read and interpret the New Testament for themselves.

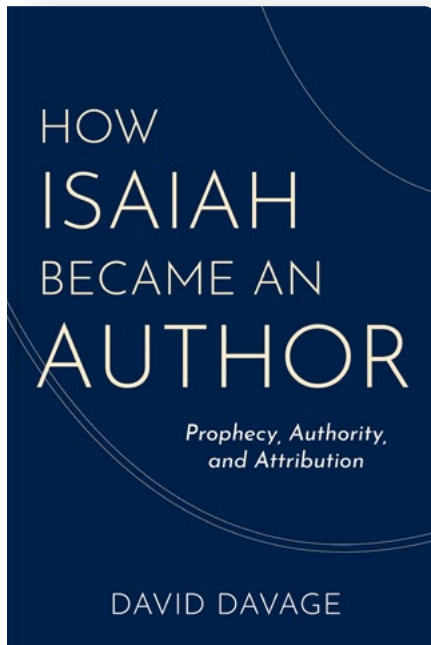

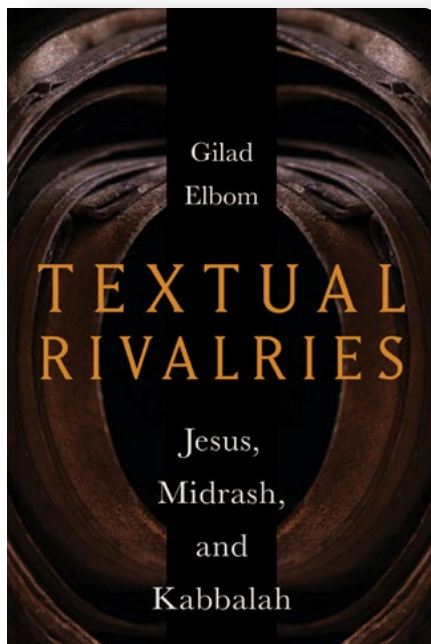
Prophecy, Authority, and Attribution

David Davage is associate professor in Old Testament exegesis at the Academy of Leadership and Theology, Umeå, Sweden. He has a PhD from Lund University, where he became a docent in 2020. His research focuses on the formation and transmission of biblical literature, especially the Psalms and Isaiah.

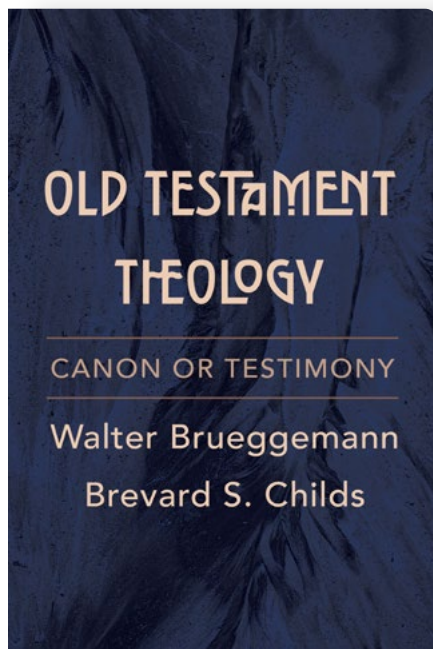

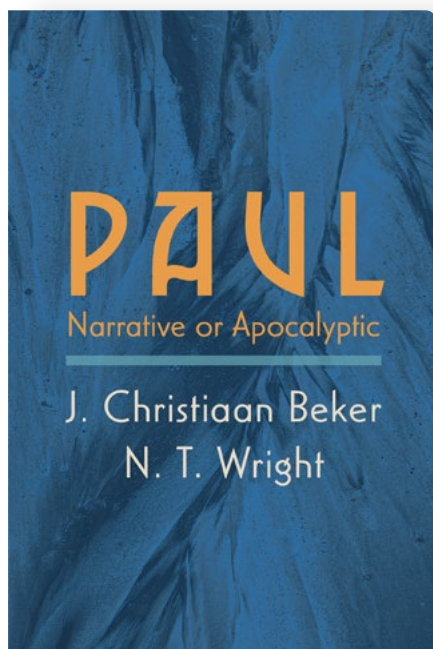
Canon or Testimony

An ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, he is regarded as the premier Old Testament interpreter and biblical theologian.

Brevard S. Childs was Sterling Professor of Divinity, Emeritus at Yale Divinity School (New Haven, Connecticut). 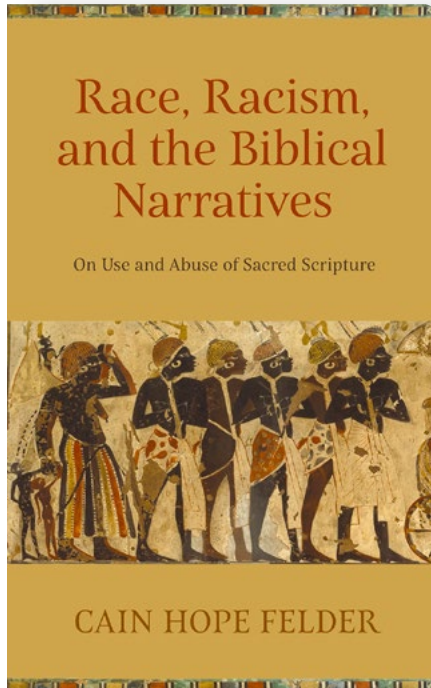

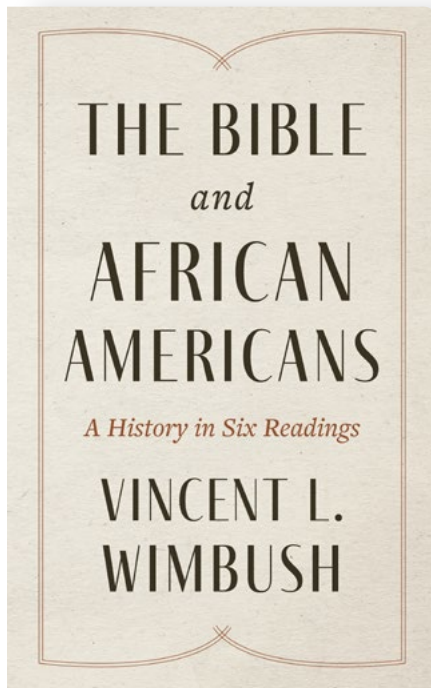

He was the author or editor of several books including *True to Our Native Land: An African American New Testament Commentary* (2007) and *Race, Racism, and the Biblical Narratives* (2002).

The Camera and Black Moral Agency from MLK to Darnella Frazier

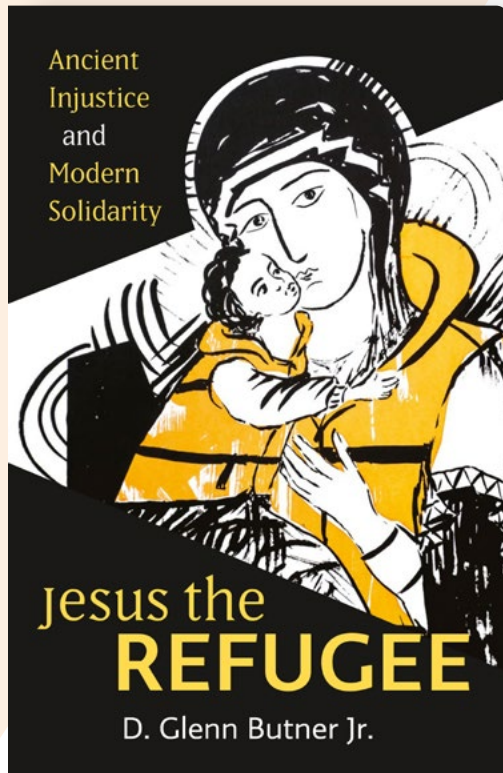
Martin Luther King used news cameras as a means of exposing anti-Black violence by white mobs in the 1950s and 60s. Darnella Frazier used her phone to record and post the murder of George Floyd by Derek Chauvin in May 2020. These are just two of many people who have captured images of injustice for the world to see.

The Prophetic Lens takes an important look at the use of the video camera as an indispensable prophetic tool for the security of Black lives and greater possibility for racial justice. Phil Allen shows how the camera can be a catalyst for cultural change, using Walter Brueggemann's *Prophetic Imagination* as a framework for understanding the concept of "prophetic." Chronicling the use of the camera, particularly in films from J.D. Griffiths' *Birth of a Nation* to Spike Lee's *Do the Right Thing*, Allen's historical approach reveals how effective this technology has been in achieving the goals of its respective storytellers.

The book highlights both the prophetic potential of the camera and the context of Blackness as a liminal existence amid a context dominated by whiteness.

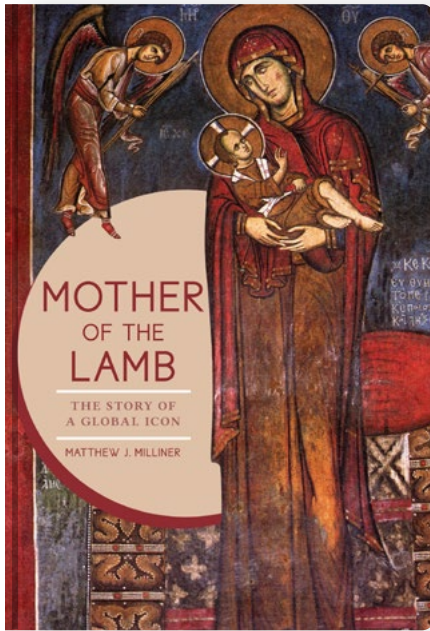
Images of modern refugees often invoke images of the infant Christ and the historical circumstances of the holy family's flight to Egypt in the face of persecution. But rather than leaving this association at the merely symbolic level, *Jesus the Refugee* explores Jesus' flight through modern legal conventions on refugee status in the United States and the European Union. Would Jesus and his parents be protected from refoulement? Would they receive rights to employment and civic engagement? Would they be turned away? Is the holy family a refugee family?

Jesus the Refugee argues that the holy family has a limited set of legal options for protection, but under current law is unlikely to receive any. This shocking claim stands or falls on legal details like the ability to demonstrate reasonable fear of persecution, or whether fleeing Palestine (but not the Roman Empire) affords protection for internally displaced migrants.

Besides introducing the basics of modern refugee law and processes, *Jesus the Refugee* aims to raise ethical challenges to our current refugee system by highlighting Jesus as one of the "least of these," indicting our moral failures and challenging us to make amends.

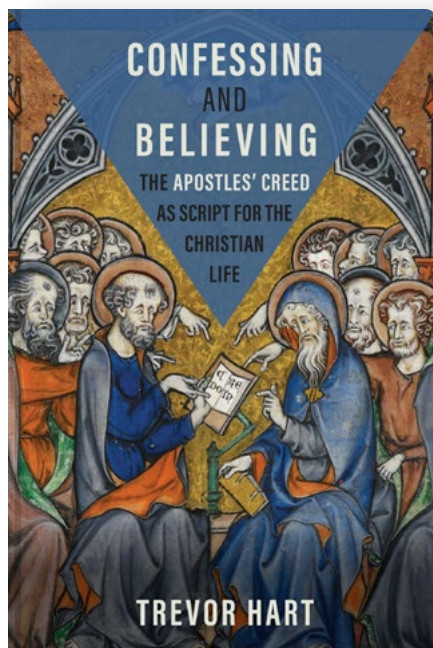
The voices of Black women have historically been silenced, especially in theological and religious contexts. Prophets rarely have platforms or prestige. Nineteenth-century Black women preachers Zilpha Elaw, Julia Foote, and Sojourner Truth are not usually presented in systematic theology classes, not often cited in sermons for their biblical interpretations, and not taught in church history.

They should be. These women present a liberating view of God and love for self and neighbor despite circumstances that would destroy them or relegate them and their ideas to the margins. As Elaw, Foote, and Truth preached, traveled, and ministered, they constructed a theology that affirmed their belovedness as Black women and enabled them to be both pastoral and prophetic. They modeled a way to do theology faithful to the biblical witness and Christian history, pastorally attentive to their respective communities and themselves, and challenging the evils of their day. They interpreted Scripture to show that God loved them and their bodies, even when the world said otherwise. And as they preached a word of comfort to the oppressed, oppressors heard—and still hear—the judgment in their voices.

Kate Hanch conducts a careful reading of their 19th-century narratives and their texts, both written and spoken, to make explicit their theology. At once a work of religious history, biography, and constructive theology, *Storied Witness* calls attention to the essential lived witness of Zilpha Elaw, Julia Foote, and Sojourner Truth.

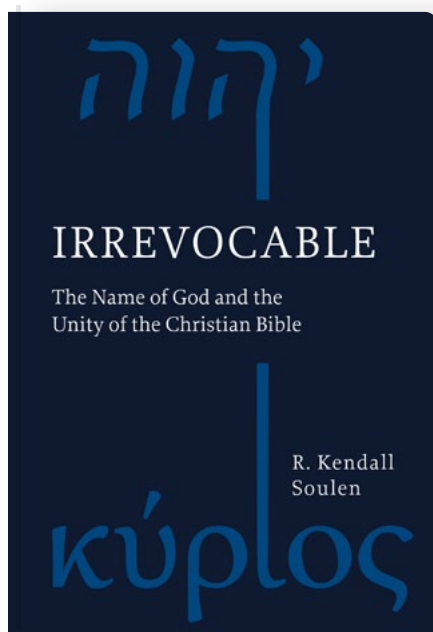

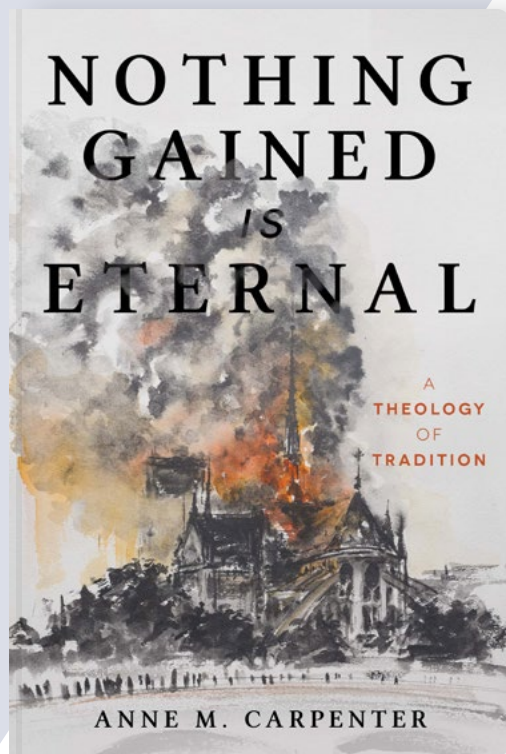

In the decades since the declaration of the “end of history,” the West has been reminded time and again that history is not yet done with us. Time marches on, but the past keeps pace. The twin questions at the heart of the last two hundred years of philosophy and theology—What is history? What is tradition?—are more pressing now than when they were first posed.
